The children's Catholic faith is more integrated into their education and it comes home with them. They are singing the music of the church everywhere they go. It's beautiful to hear. It's sometimes just simple things like my son holding the door open, one of the girls trying to help the other with her chores so that they can go outside and play, or how they help one another with studying for a quiz or test.
